The Parks and Recreation Department is working with Texas Master Naturalists in Denton County to nurture the native flora and fauna in the nature park. The park will be 21 acres of native Texas forest and prairie with trails and opportunities for environmental education and play. Central Park, located at 1899 S. Edmonds and Willow Oak, was developed in 1986 as Lewisville's Sesquicentennial Park, celebrating 150 years of independence for the Republic of Texas. The park contains 39.5 acres of which approximately 5 acres is separated on the west side of Edmonds Lane. Park amenities include: 3 picnic pavilions, band shell, playground, picnic tables,
